Chart 1. CCC Transfer Students by Status

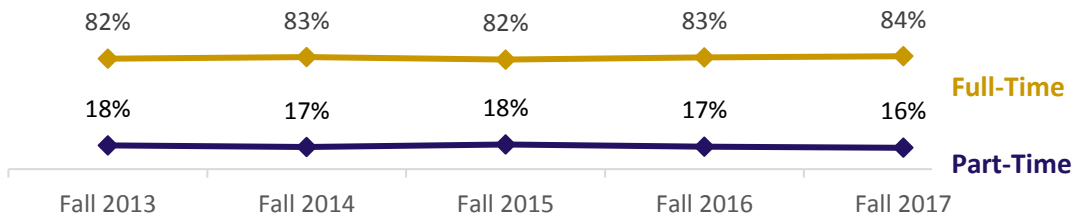

Chart 2. CCC Transfer Students by Sex

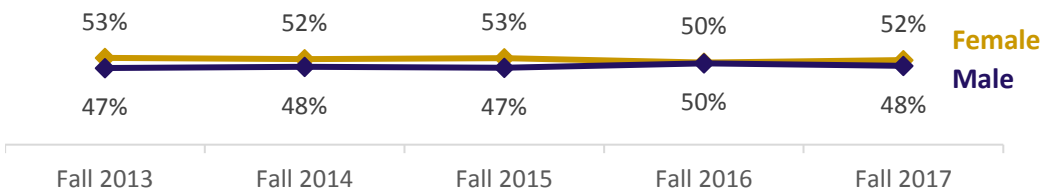

Chart 3. CCC Transfer Students by Ethnicity

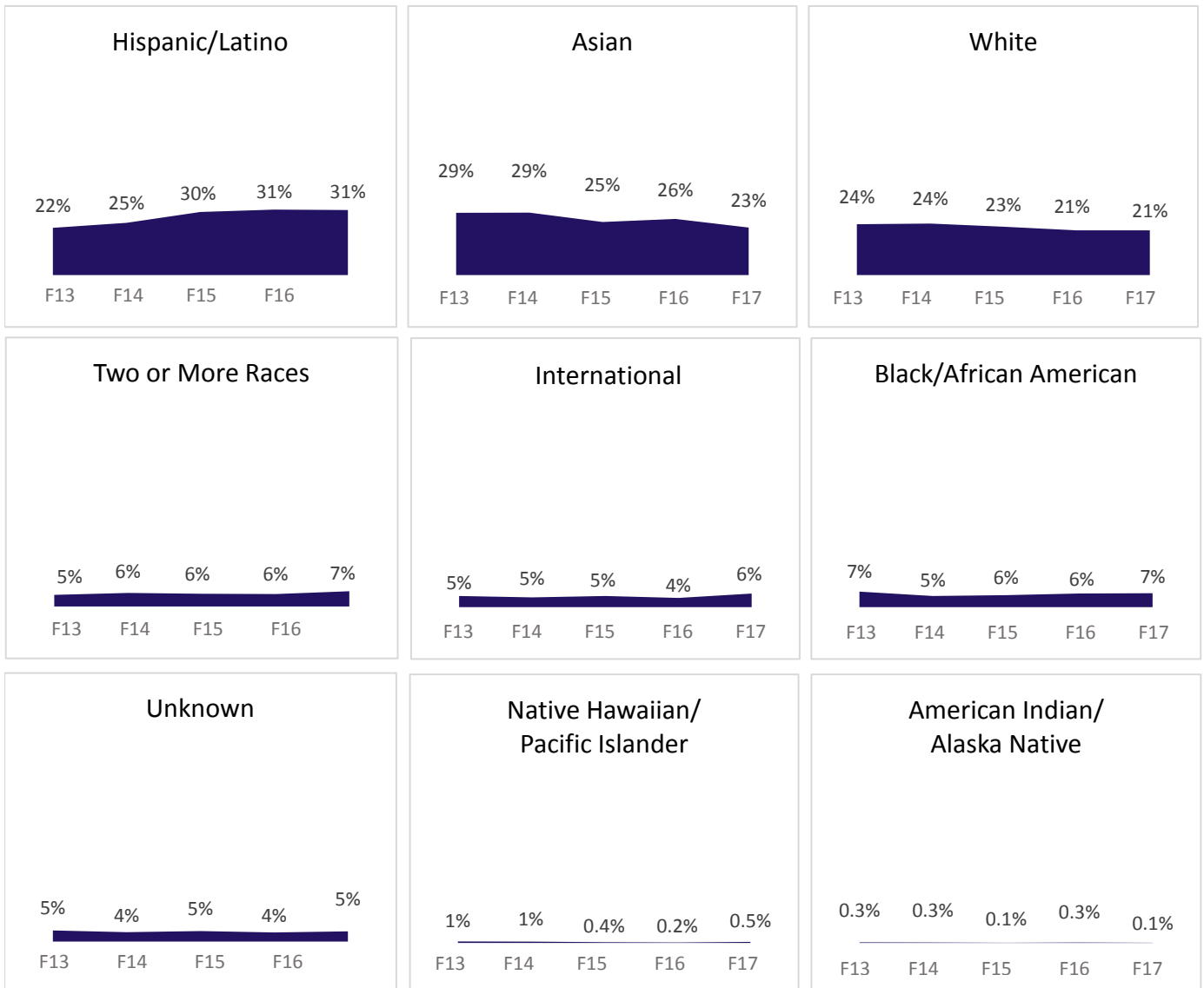

Chart 4. CCC Transfer Students by Geographic Region

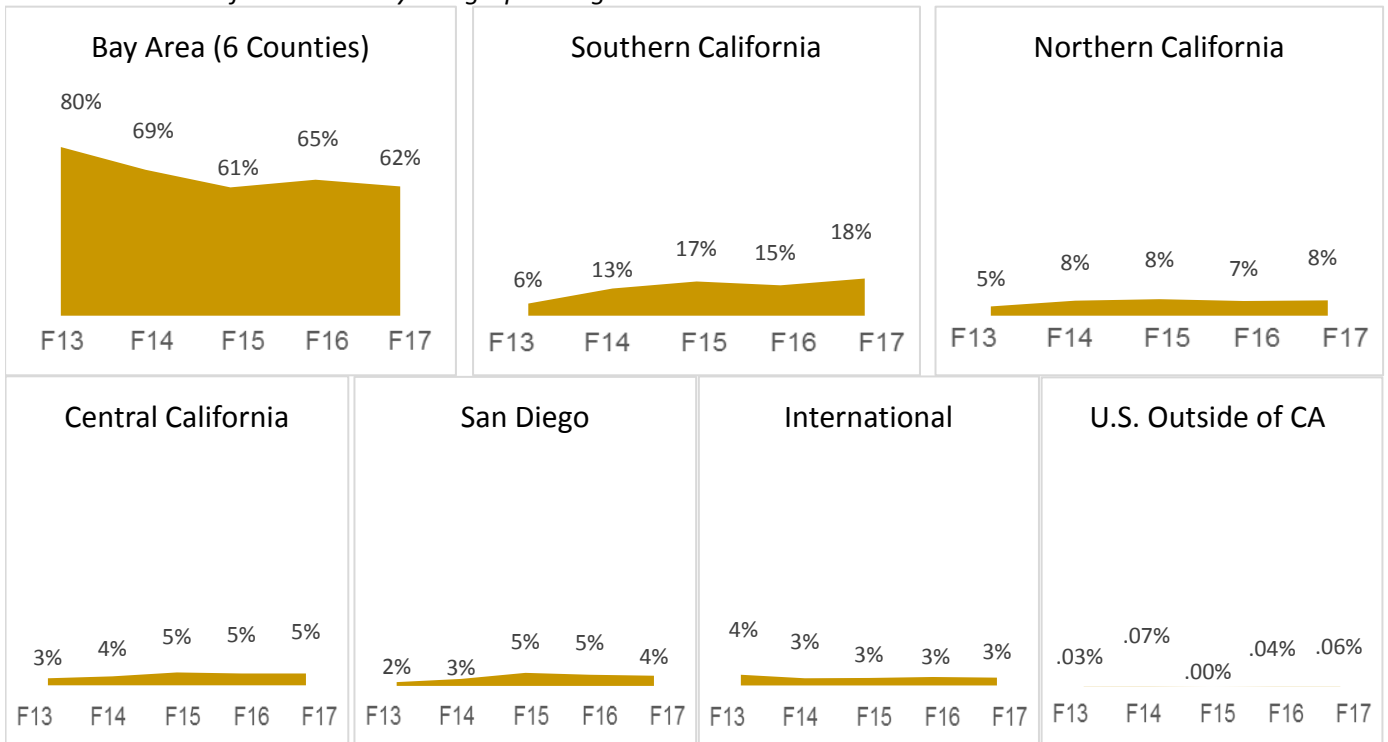

Chart 5. CCC Transfer Students by College of Primary Major

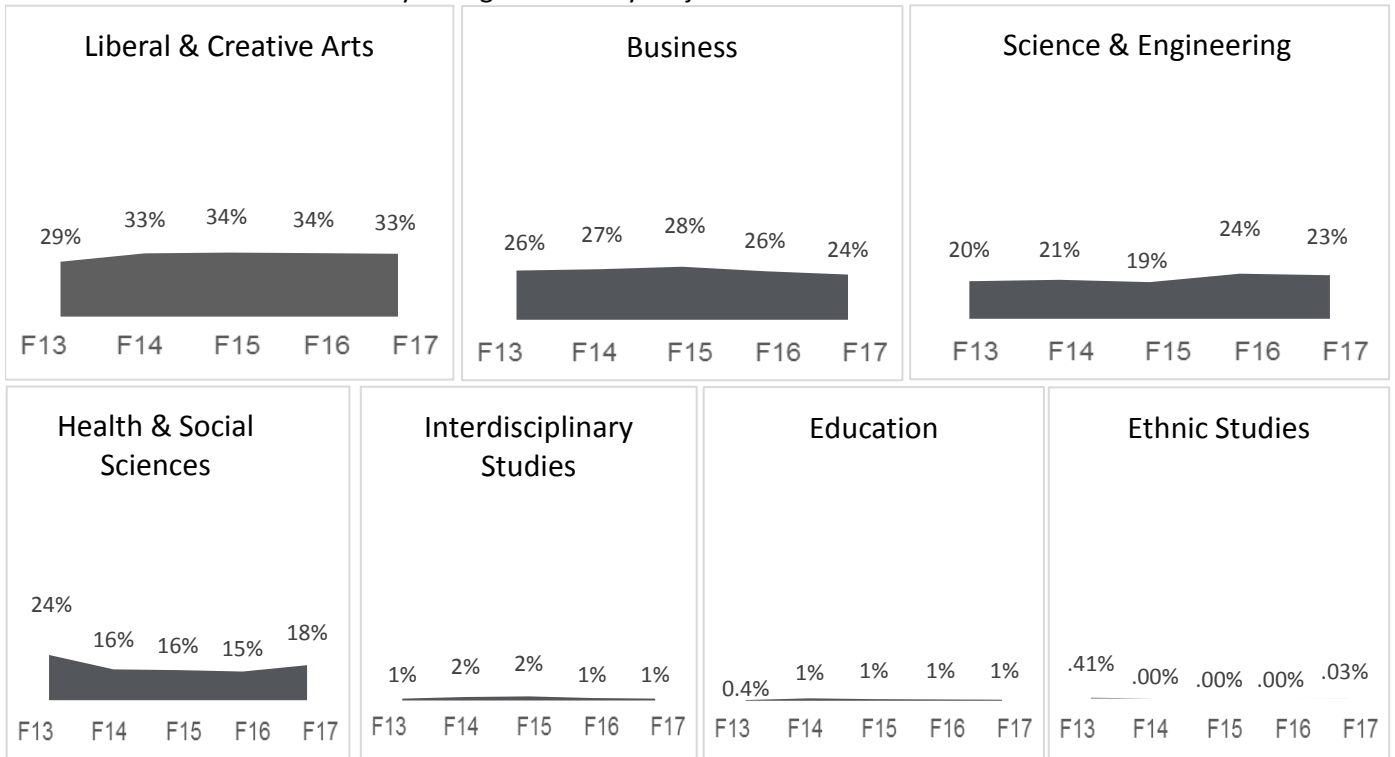
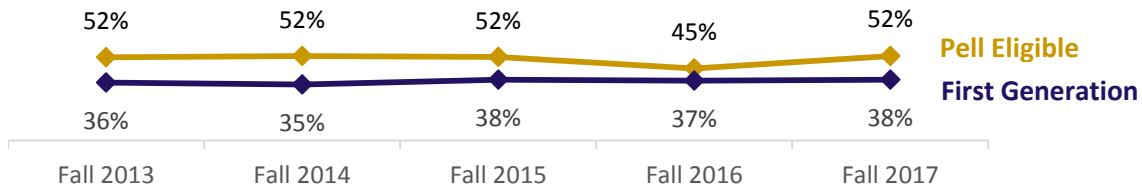

Findings:

- From fall 2013 to fall 2017, the California Community College (CCC) Transfer cohort enrollment numbers fluctuated from between (n = 2,593) to (n = 3,403). However, the ratio of full-time (~83%) to part-time (~17%) CCC transfers remained stable.
- Sex remained relatively stable over this five year period, with female CCC transfers narrowly outnumbering their male counterparts. Additionally, Fall 2013 and Fall 2015 showed the largest gap between females and males at 6%.
- CCC transfer students identifying as Hispanic/Latino constituted the largest and fastest growing ethnic group, showing a 9% increase from Fall 2013 to Fall 2017. Enrollment of the next largest student ethnic groups, Asian and White, showed a declining trend.
- Students from the Bay Area (6 counties) represent the largest CCC transfer group, although their enrollment steadily declined throughout this five-year period. Enrollment from Southern California, on the other hand, steadily increased.
- Liberal and Creative Arts was the top college of major for CCC transfer students during this period. The College of Science and Engineering saw an increase in CCC Transfer students, while Health and Social Sciences and Business saw a general decrease.
- During this period, over half of the CCC transfer students were pell eligible. Additionally, based on student reporting of parental education, more than one-third of the CCC transfer students were classified as first generation.
