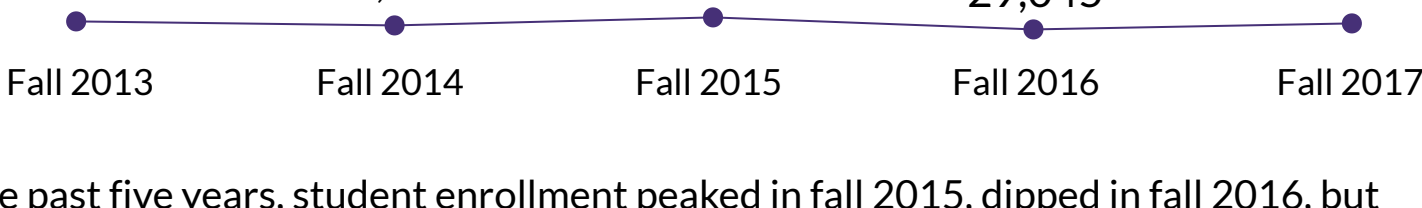

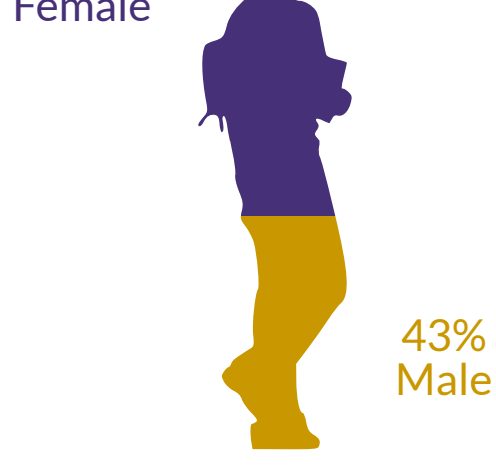

Enrollment Trend



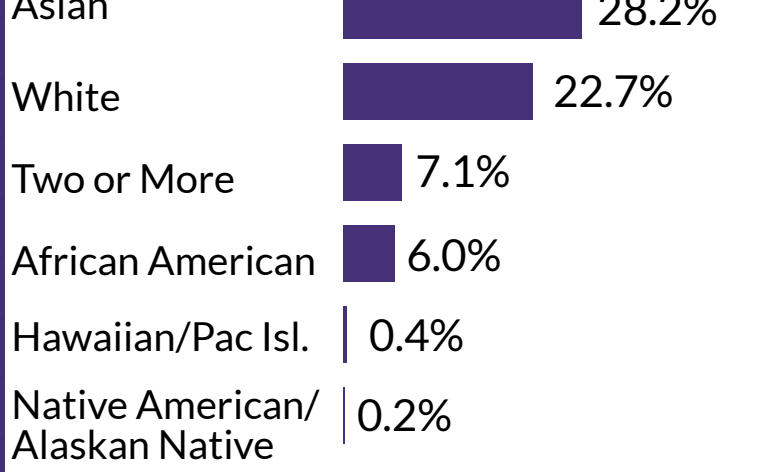
In the past five years, student enrollment peaked in fall 2015, dipped in fall 2016, but showed an upward trend in fall 2017.

Sex



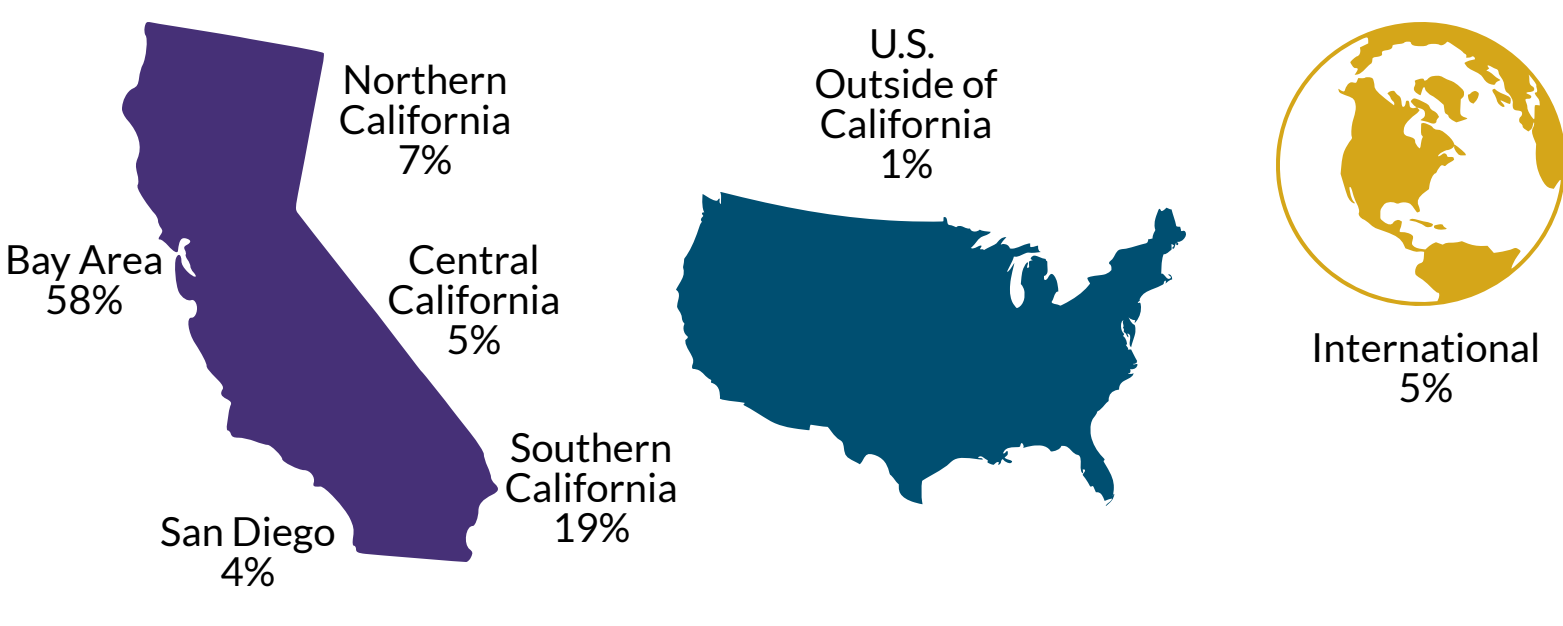
Females outnumbered males by approximately 14% in fall 2017 (57% female to 43% male).

Residence at Time of Application

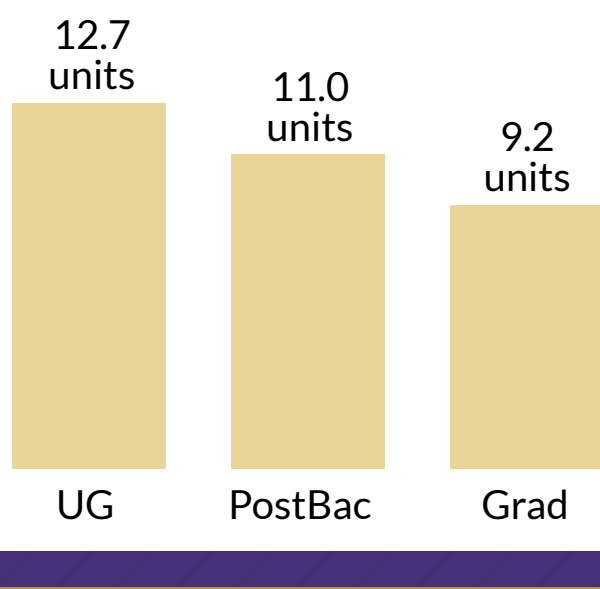


The majority of our students come from the Bay Area (58%). However, SF State continues to attract students from Southern California (19%), including an additional 4% from San Diego.

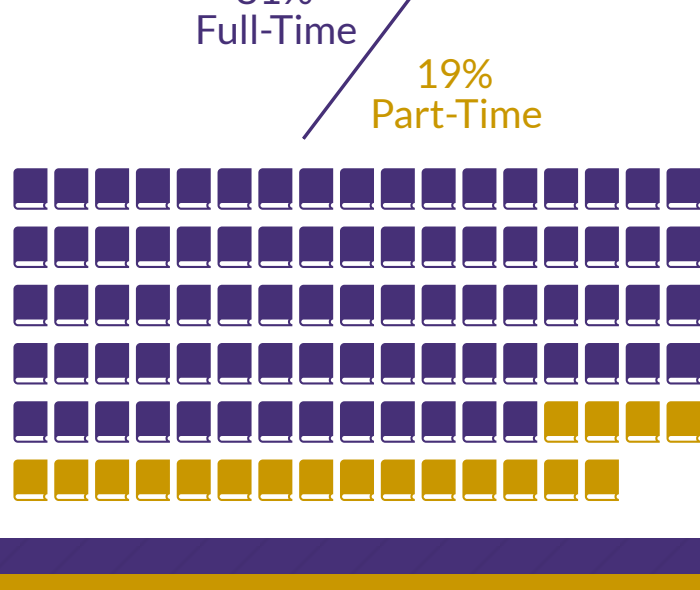

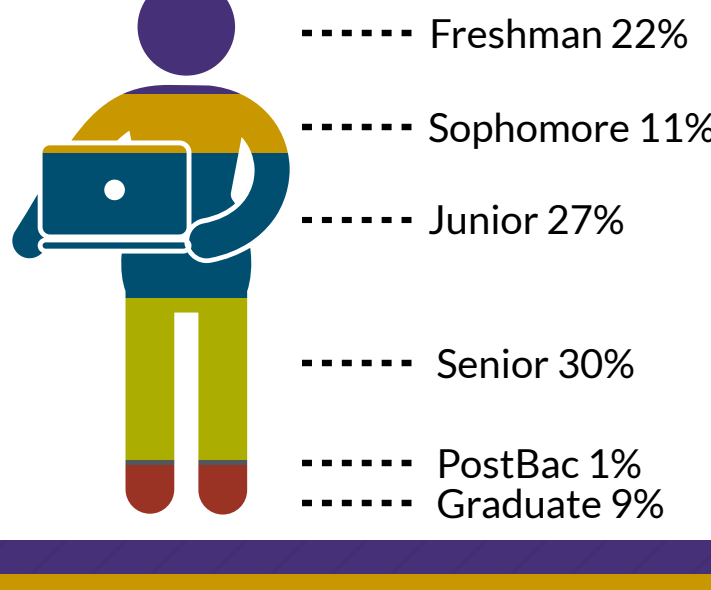

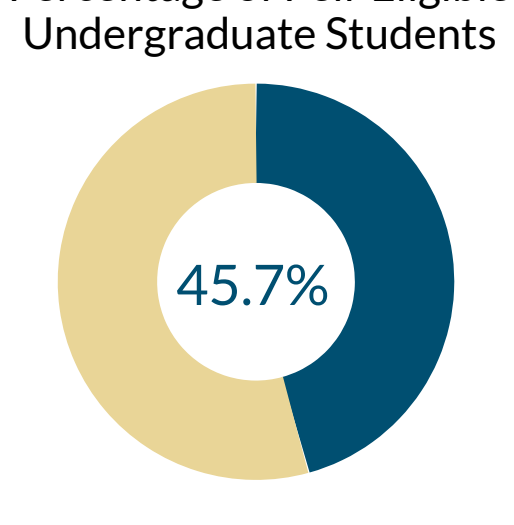

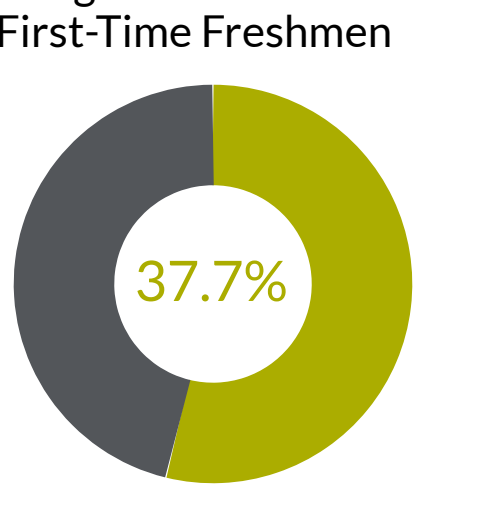

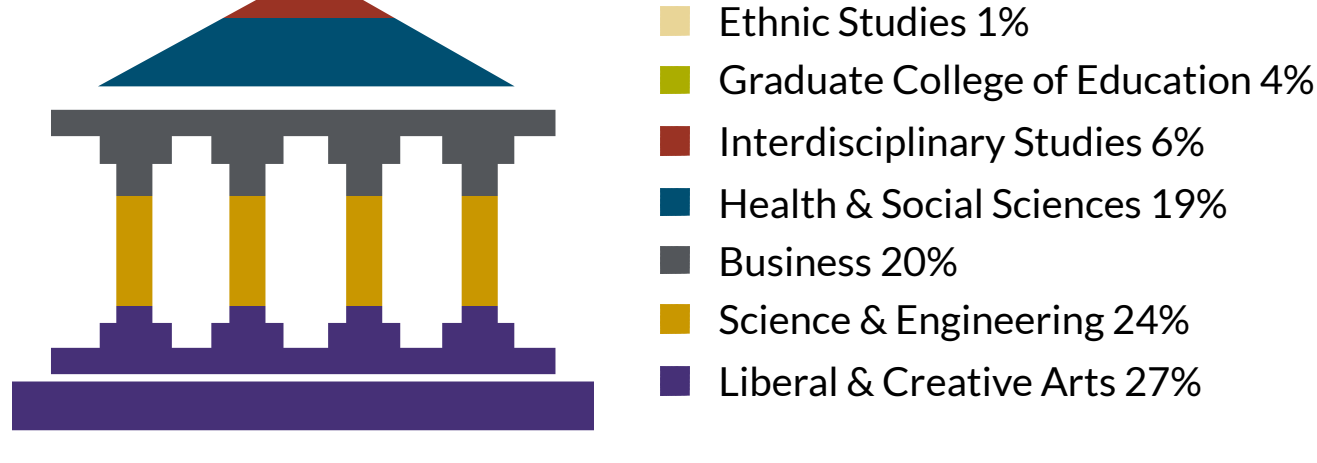
First Generation

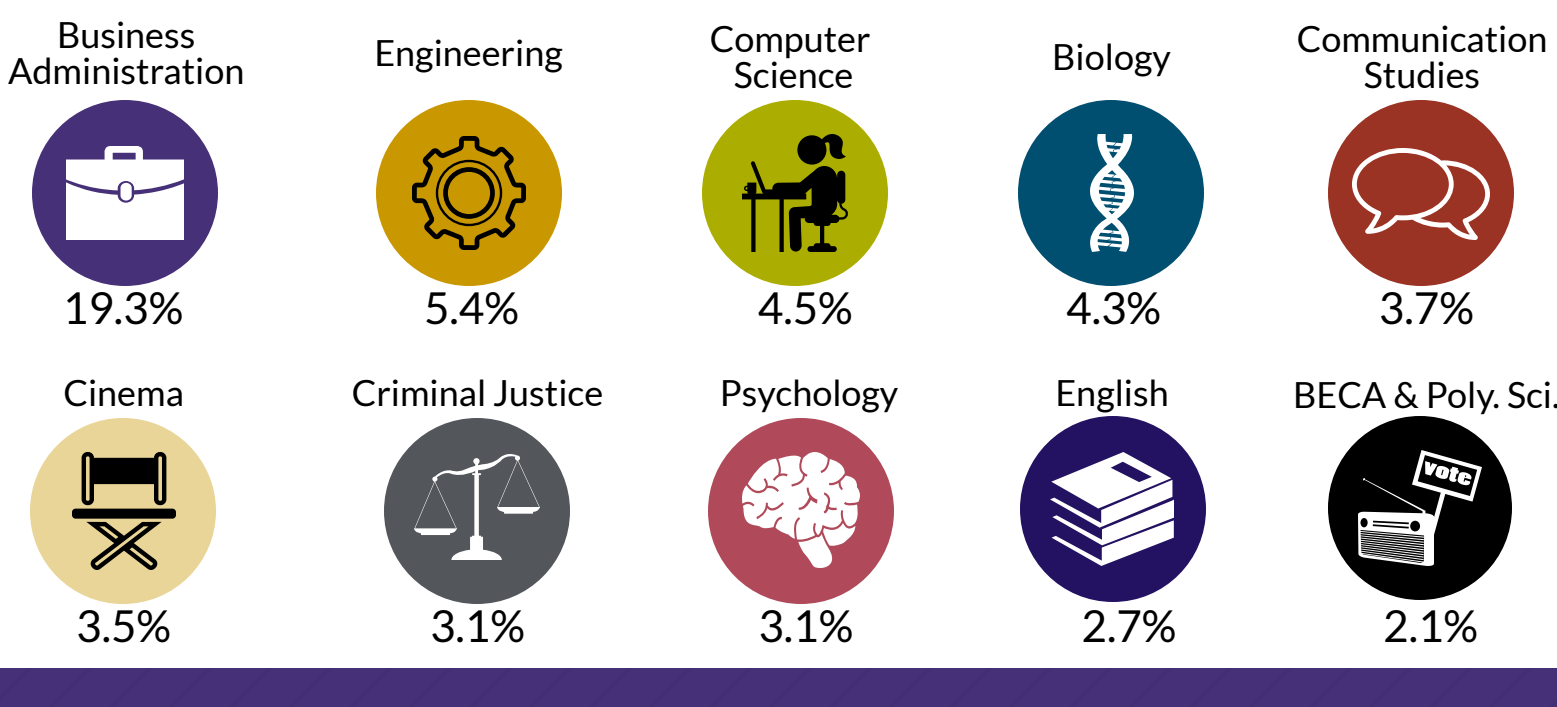
Enrollment by College

Percentage of Students Enrolled by College



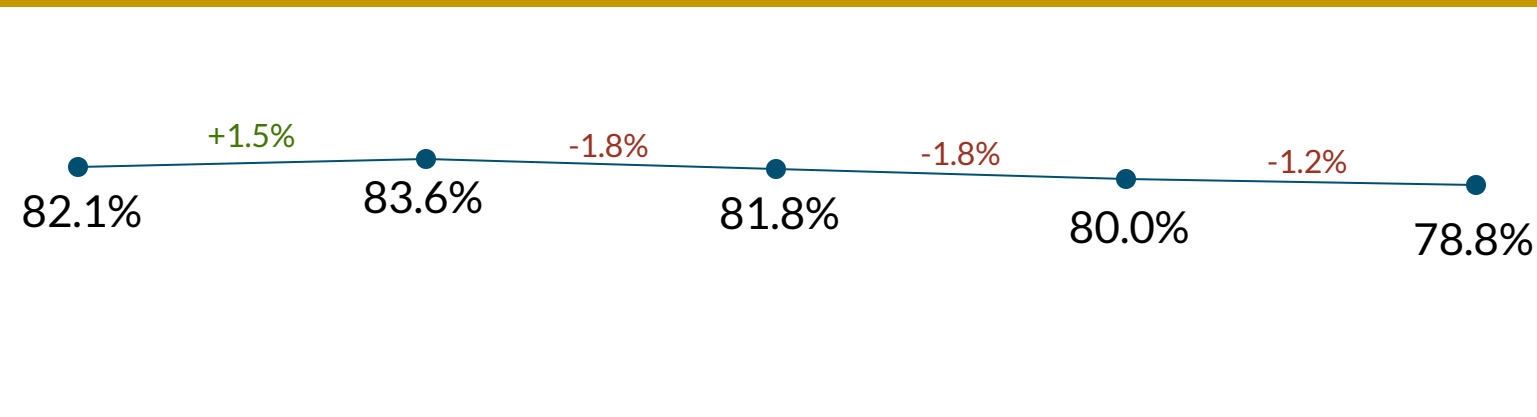
In fall 2017, a considerable percentage of students majored within the College of Liberal and Creative Arts (27%), followed by Science and Engineering (24%), and Business (20%).

Top 10 Undergraduate Majors



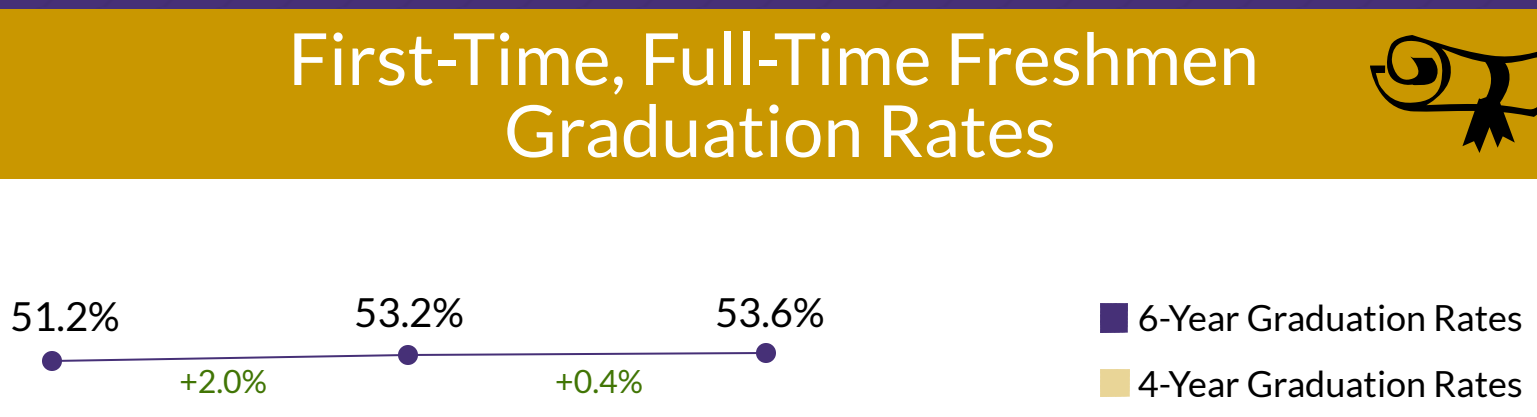
Business Administration continues to be the largest undergraduate major in fall 2017.

First-Time, Full-Time Freshmen 1-Year Continuation Rates



First-time, full-time freshmen 1-year continuation rates have remained roughly static, but have dipped slightly in recent years.

First-Time, Full-Time Freshmen Graduation Rates



First-time, full-time freshmen 4- and 6-year graduations rates have steadily increased. Specifically, the most recent 4- and 6-year graduation rates (22.2% for fall 2013 and 53.6% for fall 2011, respectively) are at the highest points since fall 2009.
