The **National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE)** measures special extracurricular activities which are linked to learning, retention and engagement.

These activities are known as **high-impact practices (HIPs)**.

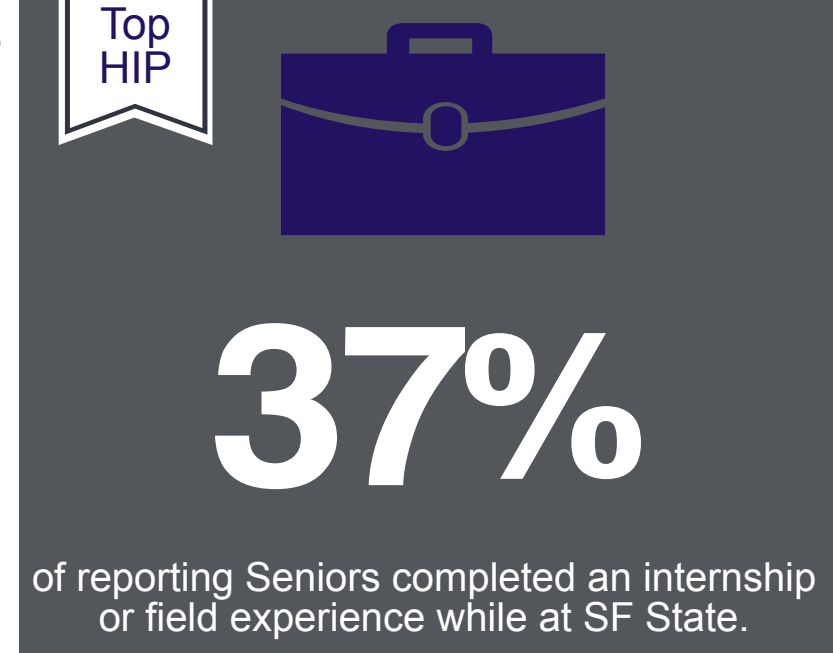
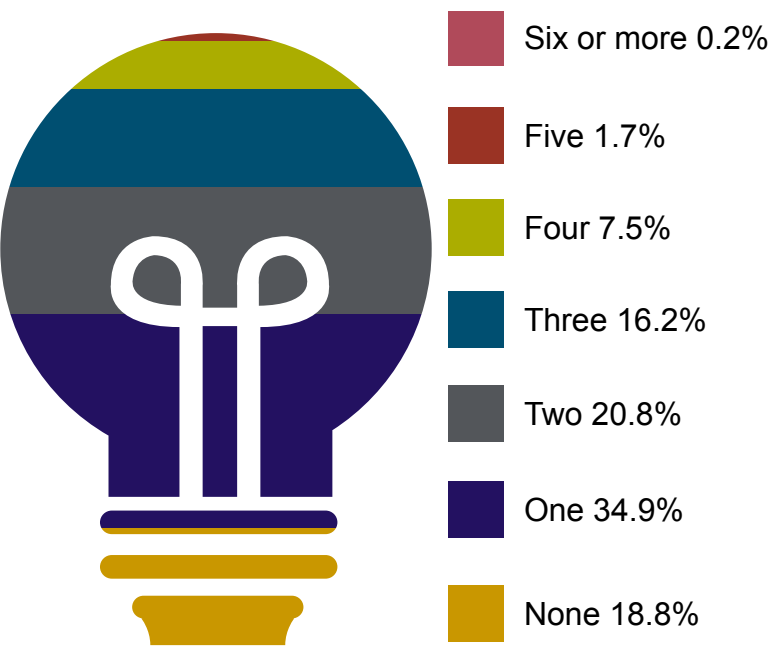
The NSSE includes seven HIPs:

- Service-Learning

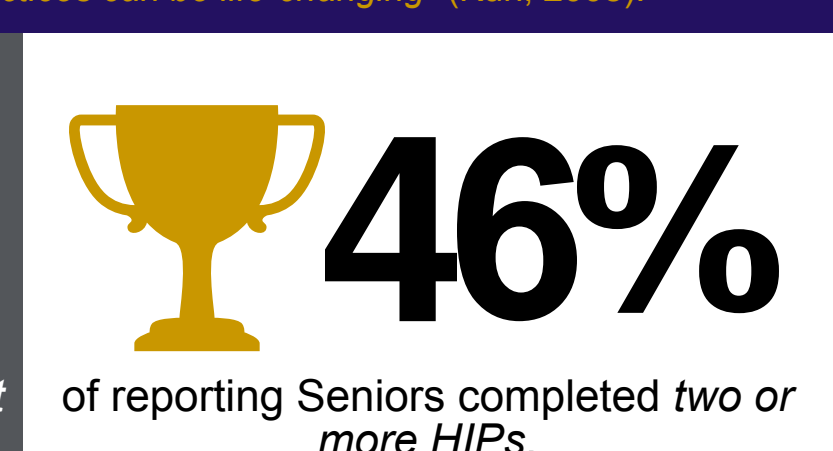
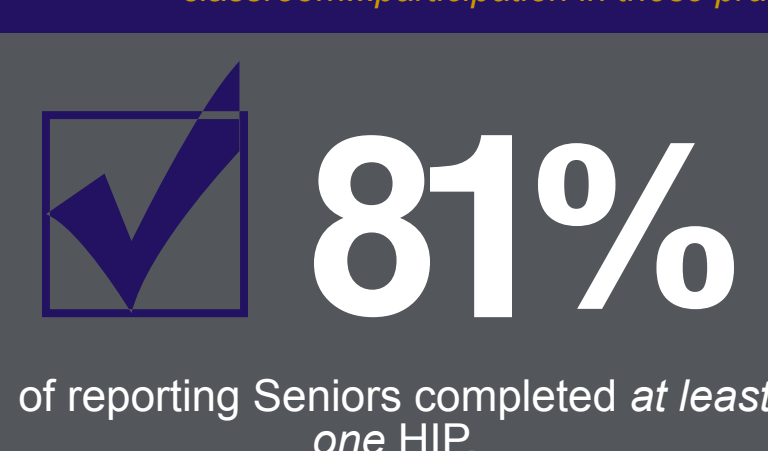


SF State Senior HIP Participation

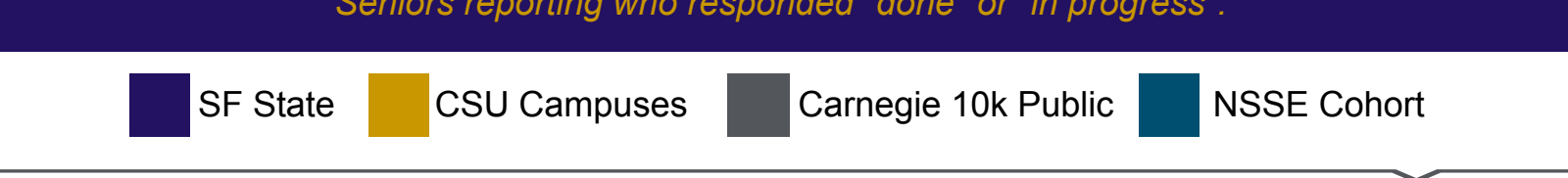
1,490 Seniors at SF State completed the NSSE in 2017. Response rate: 17%.



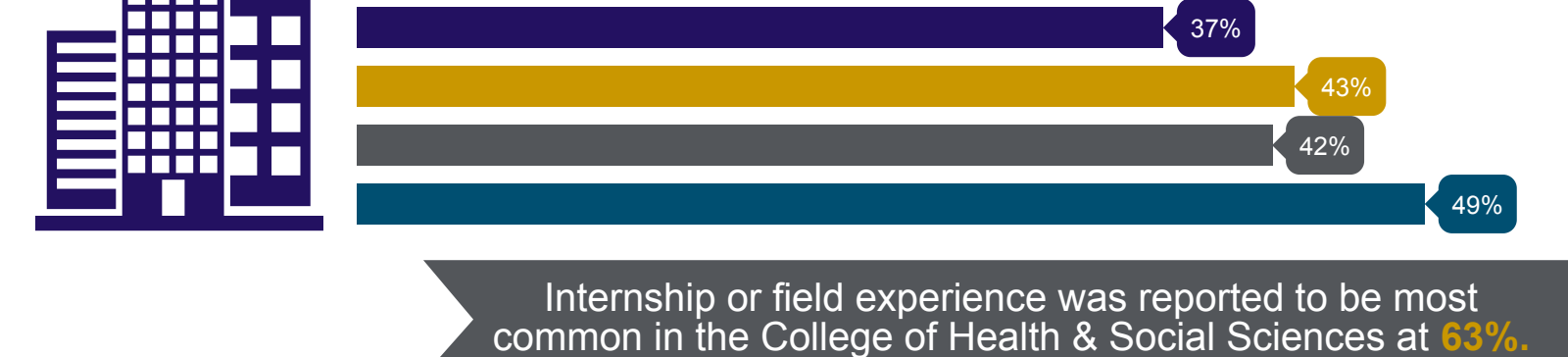
Why Complete HIPs?
 "They demand considerable time and effort, facilitate learning outside of the classroom...participation in these practices can be life-changing" (Kuh, 2008).



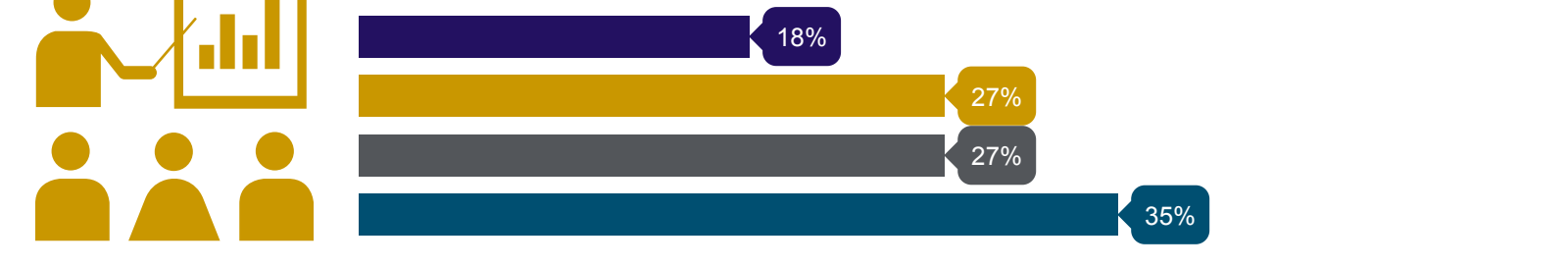
How Does SF State Compare with other Institutions on HIPs?
 Seniors reporting who responded "done" or "in progress".



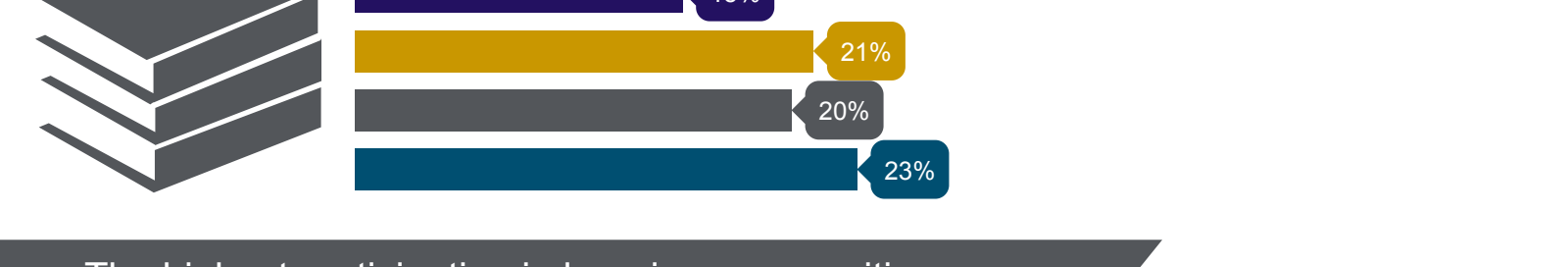

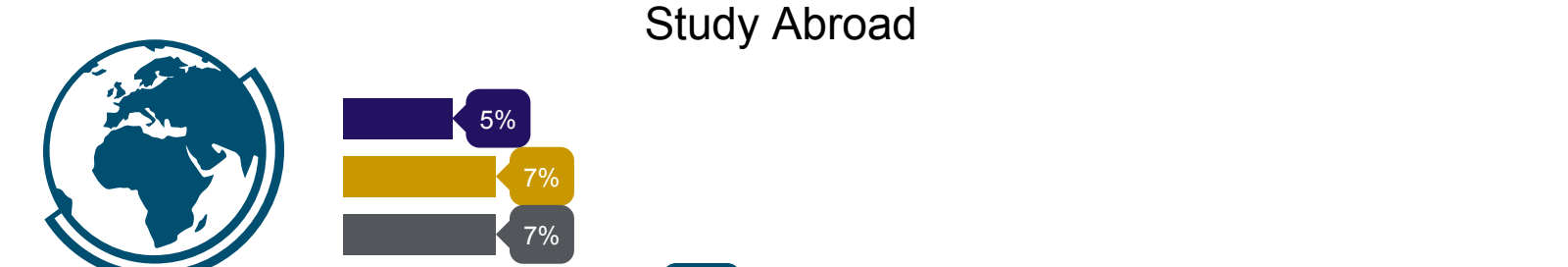

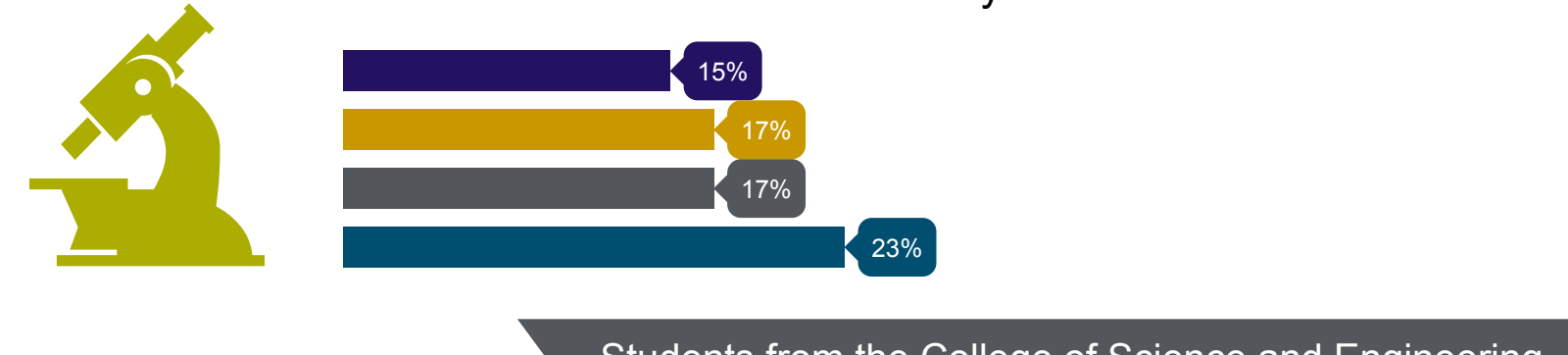

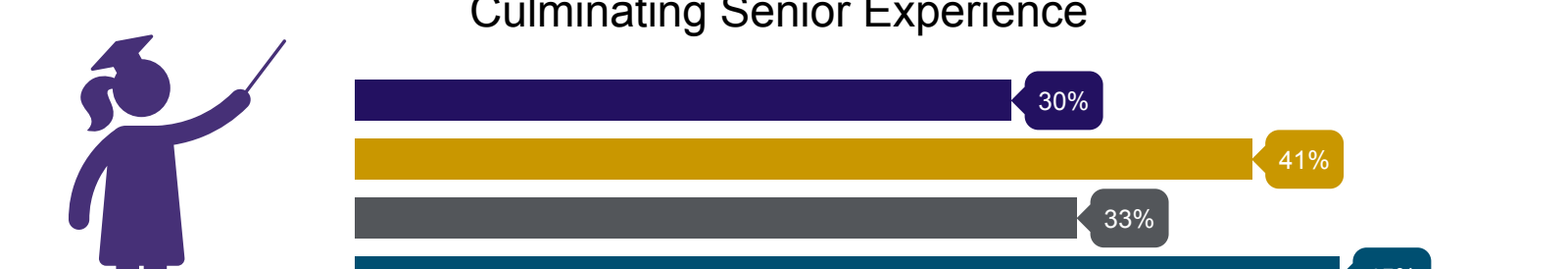

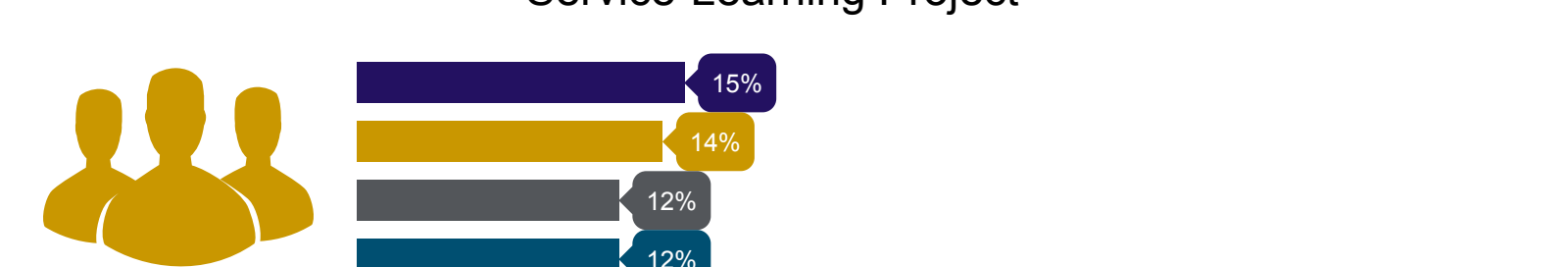

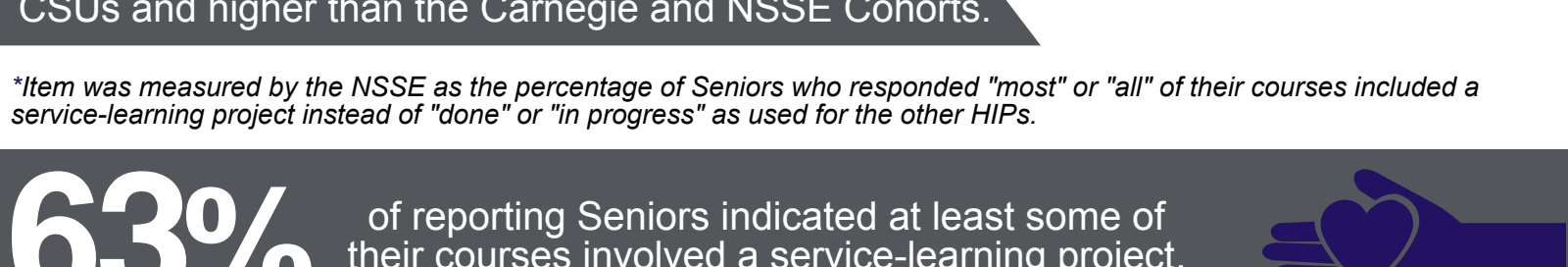

Service-Learning Project*

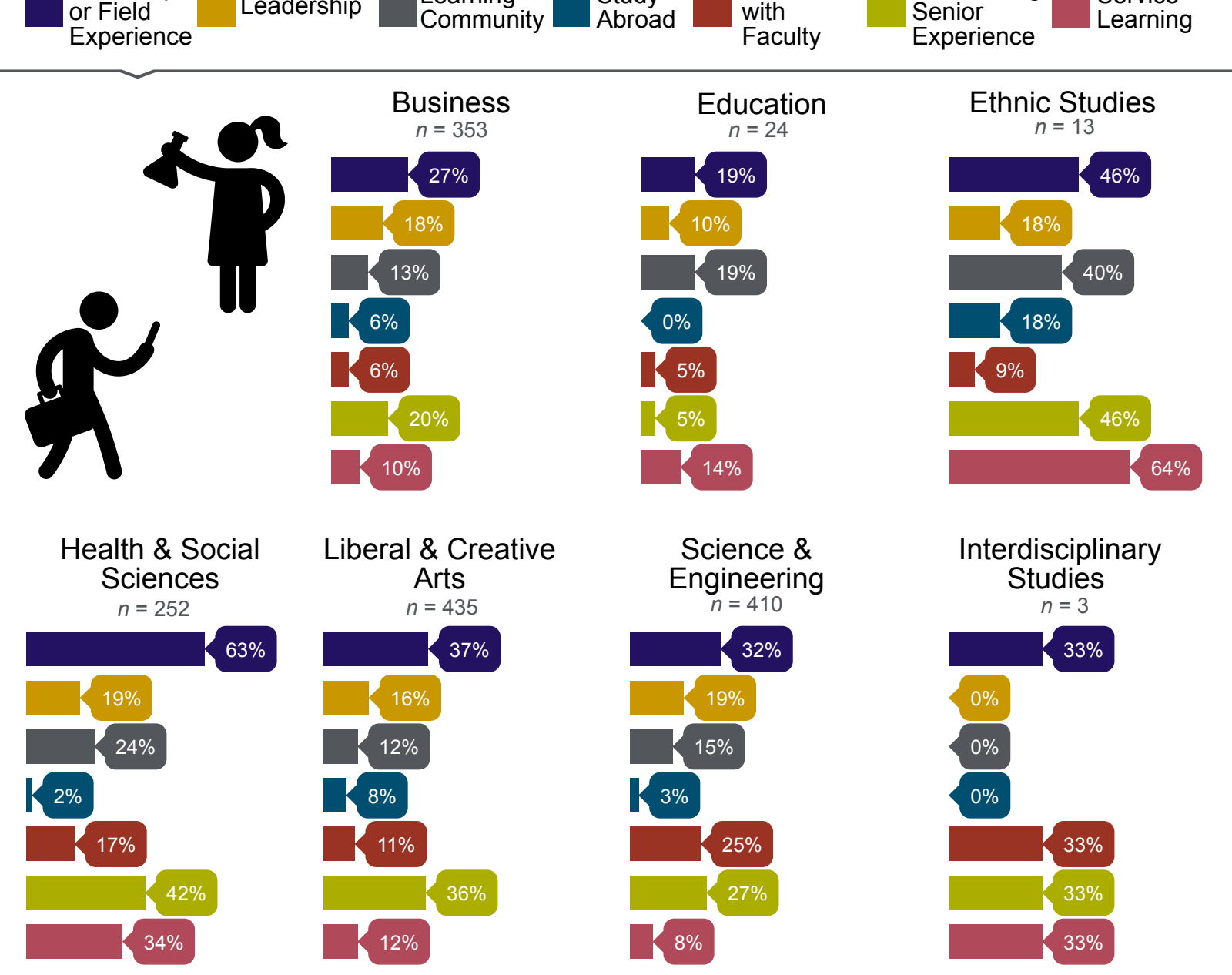
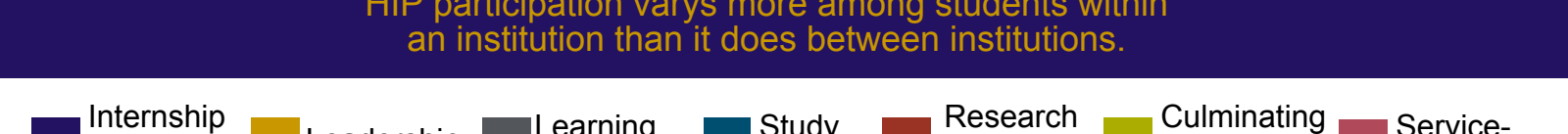

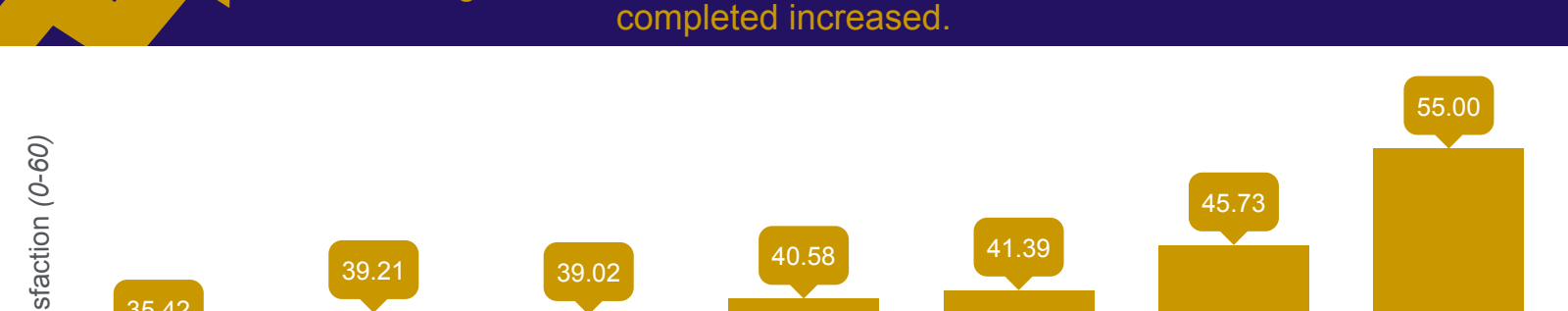
How Did HIPs Vary By College?

HIP participation varies more among students within an institution than it does between institutions.



Are HIPs Related to Student Satisfaction?

On average, mean satisfaction increased as number of HIPs completed increased.
