
If you did not graduate in the time expected, what is the main reason why not?












There was a spike in family responsibilities in 2024. Potentially due to low sample size error.



Text Mining Analysis

22% of students indicated "Other" as the main reason they will have <u>not</u> graduated in the time expected. Students had the opportunity to expand upon their response through an openended text box. **Top themes** that emerged are shown below:

1. COVID-19 Disruption

(e.g. specifically attributing failing a class to the pandemic)

2. Credit / Transfer / Course Requirement

(e.g. credit transfer issue, low priority registration)

3. Mental Health / Health / Personal Challenges

(e.g. medical, family emergency, probation)

4. Academic Advising / Administrative Issues

(e.g. misunderstanding an academic advisor)

• Students Age 24 and Under were more likely to indicate improvements to Campus Life would have improved their overall experience than Students Age 25 and Over.











4. Improvement in Intellectual Abilities – 5 Year Trend









The top two plans students reported upon graduation were **employment** and **graduate study**.



For students who selected "Employment" as their Post-Graduation plan, 43% agreed or strongly agreed that SF State has prepared them for the workplace.



For students who selected "Graduate Study" as their Post-Graduation plan, 78% agreed or strongly agreed that SF State has prepared them for graduate school.



Limitations

- Number of participants significantly decreased due to administrative change to recruiting participants.
 - 2021 2024: (>~ 10% of graduating seniors)
 - 2020 and before: 80-90% of graduating seniors
- COVID-19 continued to impact findings, which are noticeably different than years past. Including:
 - Sudden changes in students' lives from finances to mental health and their overall experience at SFSU (enrollment, grades)
 - Engagement in student activities
 - Challenges with online courses
- We measured perceptions, which may not be objective
