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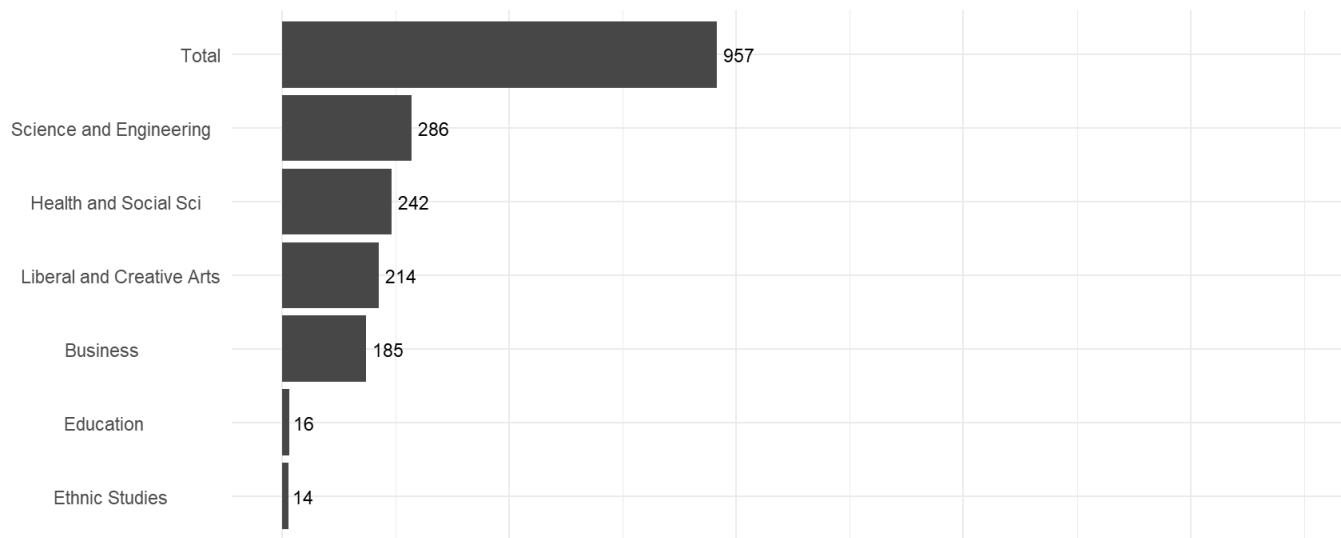
## The Survey

The Senior Exit Survey (SES) is administered on an ongoing basis to undergraduate students just prior to completing their application for graduation. Completion of the SES is listed as one of the steps on the Registrar's Graduation Checklist for undergraduate applicants.

The data are collected throughout the calendar year (January 1st – December 31st) and are analyzed annually in the spring semester. The Senior Exit Survey instrument covers 6 dimensions and is intended to explore students' academic and co-curricular experiences at San Francisco State University.

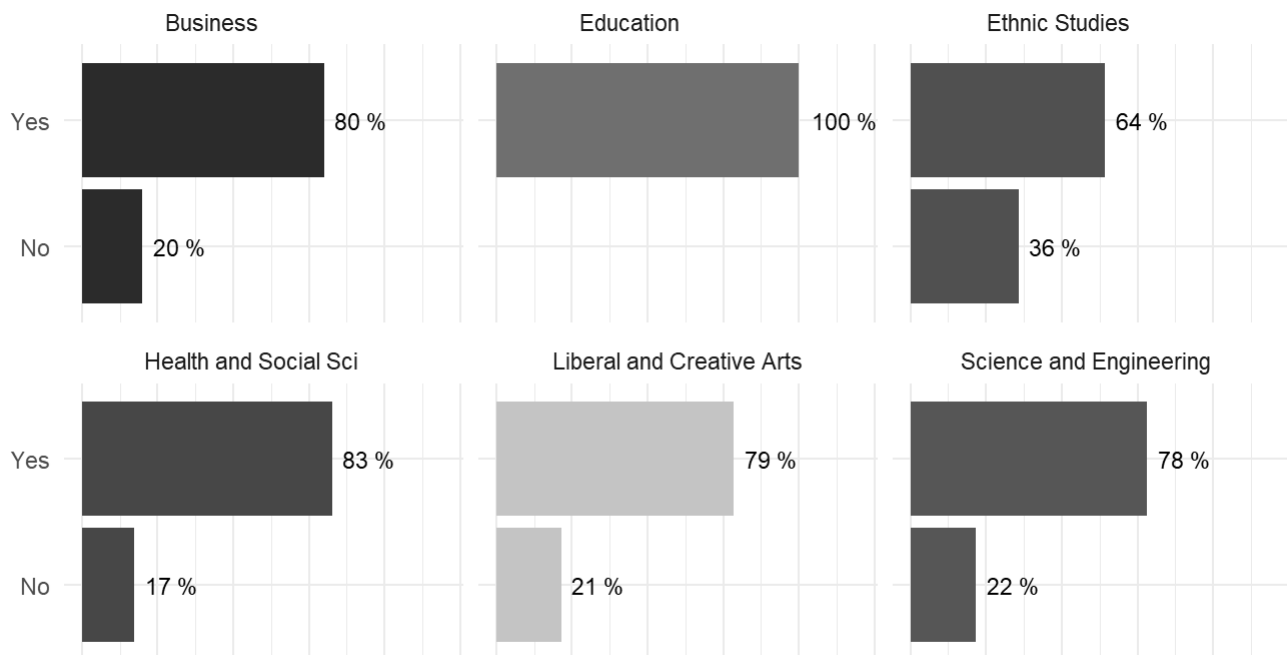

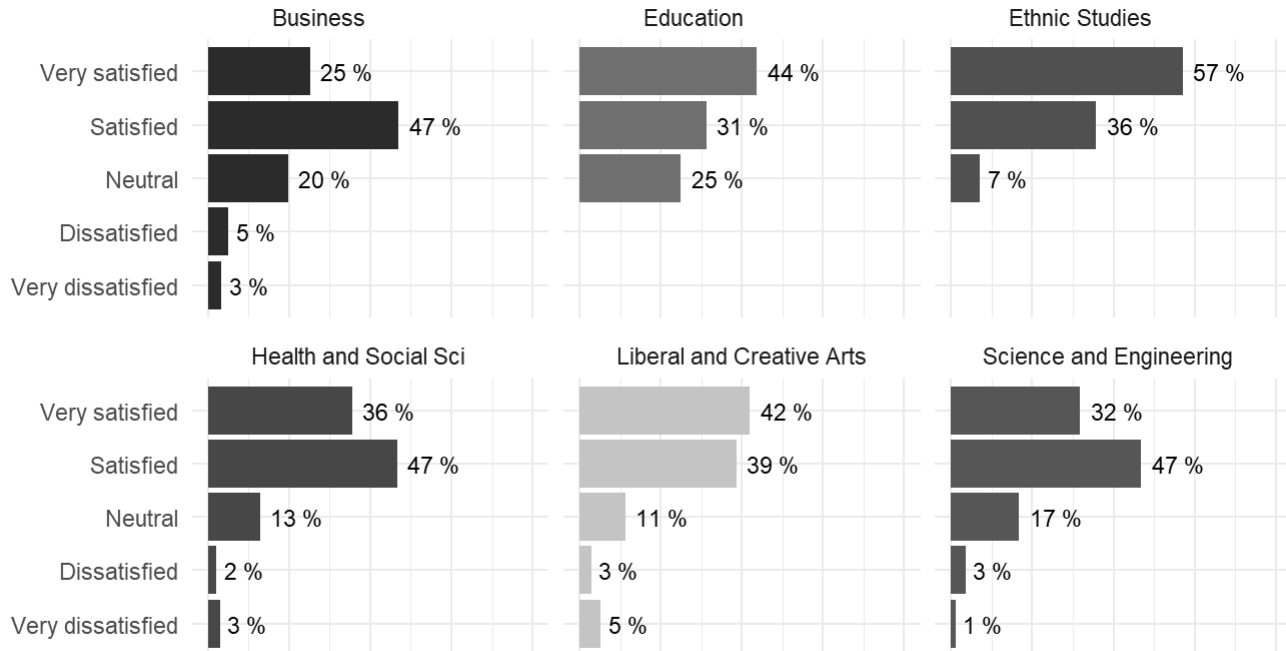

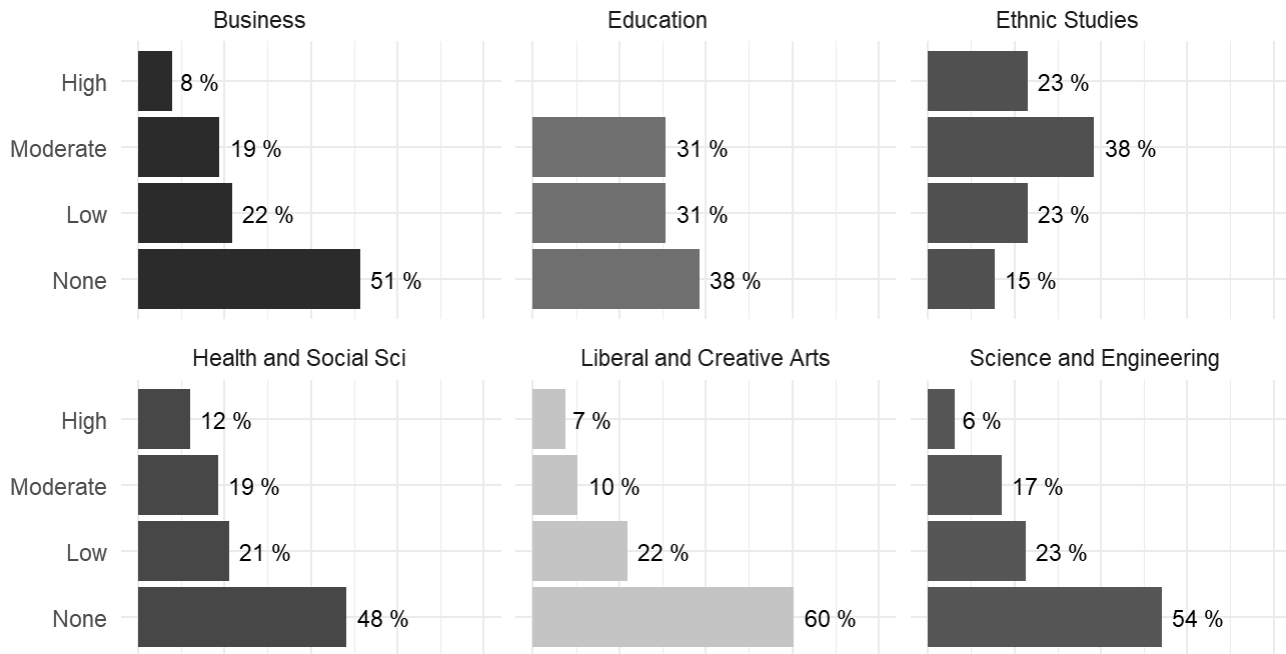

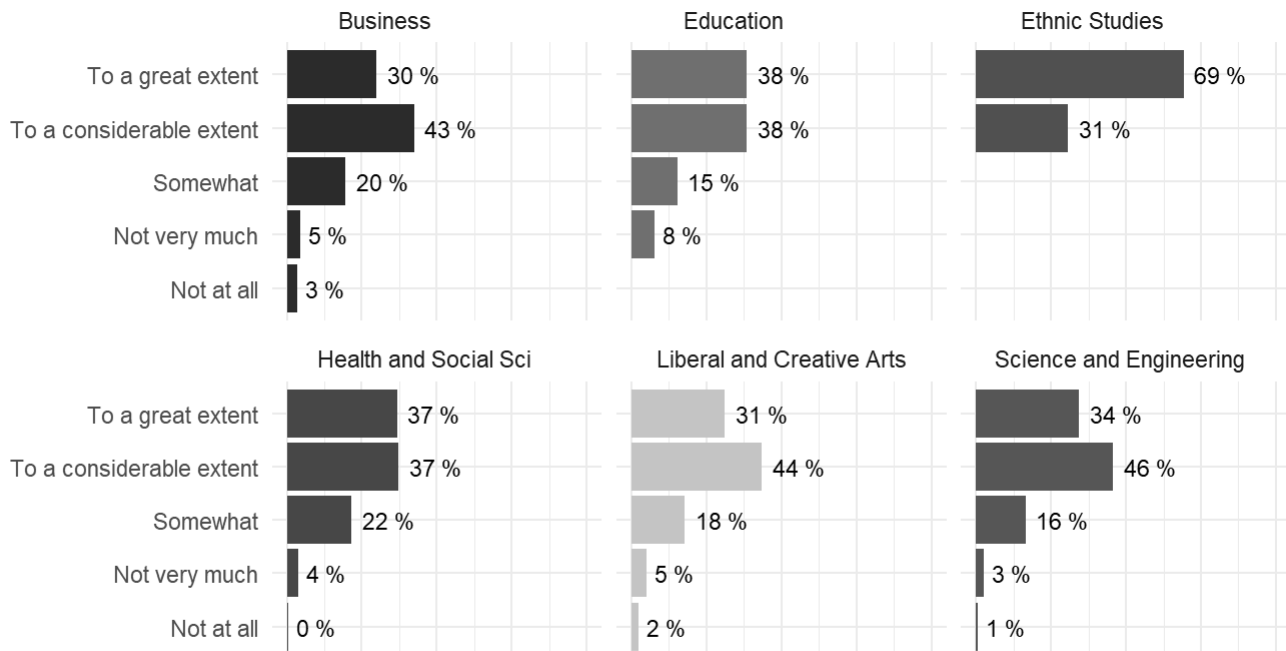

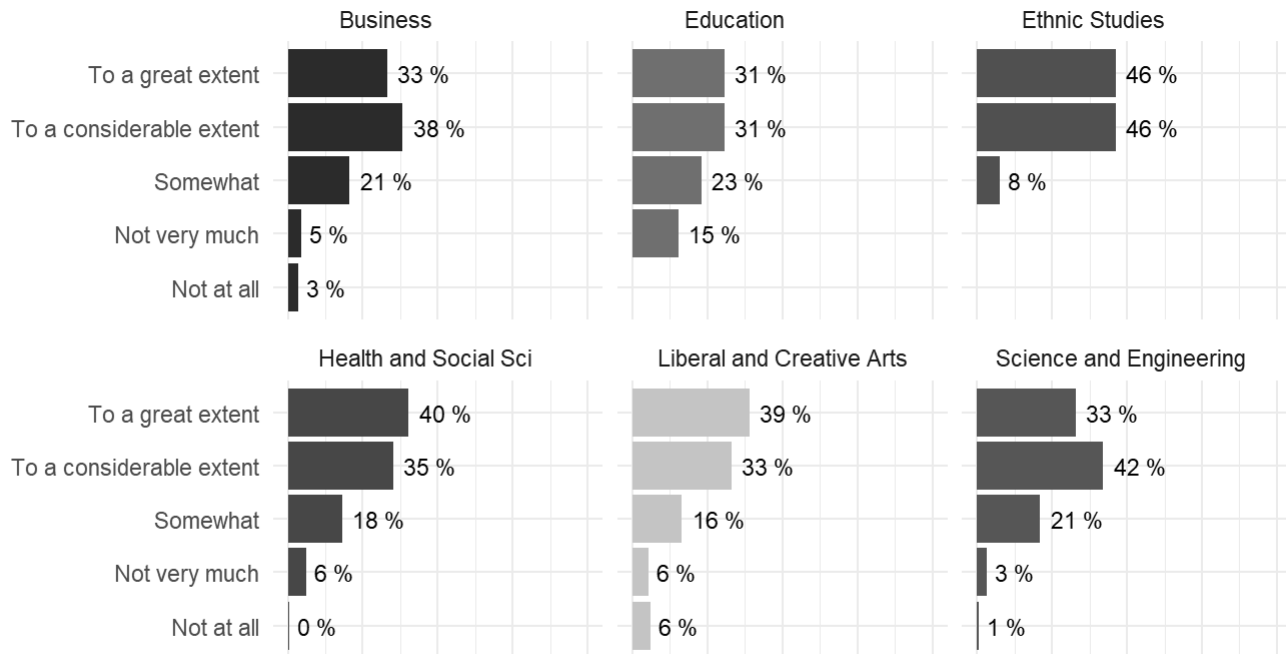

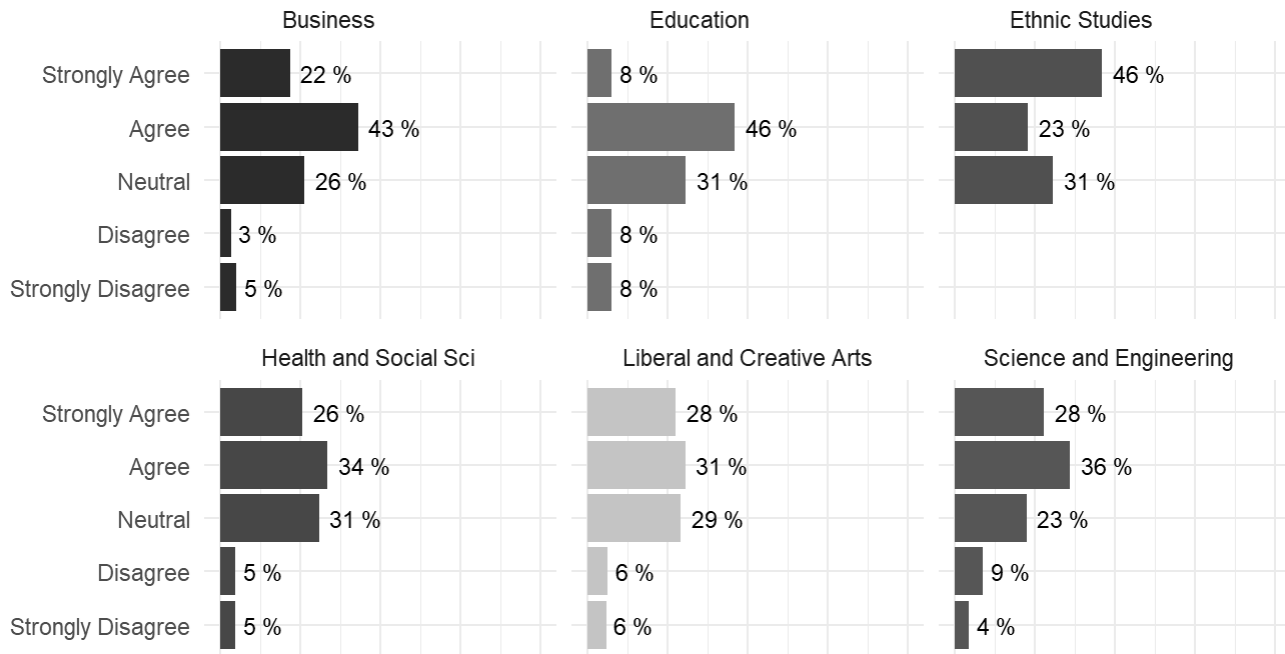
